

Summer is nearing the end with fall on the horizon already! The season has passed by quickly, but that tends to be the case when it's busy. The Nebraska Angus Association has been putting in countless hours to bring to you great events to round out the summer.

The first event will be the open Angus show at the Nebraska State Fair. The open show will take place August 28th at 9 A.M. in Ring 1 at the Five Points Bank Arena with Brady Jensen as the judge. Entries close August 10th with late entries at a double entry fee by August 15th. The Nebraska Angus Association gives out an extra \$250 to the top Nebraska bred and owned bull and female. Supreme drive will take place August 29th at 5 P.M. and has \$12,000 added money for supreme open female and bull winners. Also, there will be added money for each breed including \$75 for breed grands and \$50 for breed reserve grands and \$500 for champion cow / calf pairs and \$250 for reserve cow / calf pairs.

Following the Nebraska State Fair will be the annual Nebraska Angus Tour along with the "newly added" Nebraska Angus Association annual meeting and banquet on September 20th and 21st in the southeastern district. A lot of preparation has been made for this year's tour and it is shaping up to be one of the largest yet! This year there will be 15 different Angus operations displaying or hosting a stop on the tour along with three special interest stops including a tour at the Neogen lab, taking a look at the Engler program and its history at the University of Nebraska Lincoln, and see where HeatSiecker patches are made near Martell, and a stop at the USDA Meat Research facility at Clay Center. This tour will offer lots of great fellowship, food, prizes, a chance to win a heifer, and allow everyone to attend our Nebraska Angus Association annual meeting and banquet. You do not have to be a Nebraska Angus Association member to attend the tour or annual meeting and banquet. We invite everyone to join us and share with us your Angus experience or ideas for the future of our organization! A hotel room block has been made at the Fairfield Inn & Suites in Crete under the Nebraska Angus Tour. There have been some problems with their front desk not knowing anything about the room block so please select the reservations option when you call and they can get you set up. That Friday is a Husker football game in Lincoln, so please plan ahead to make sure there is availability! Other lodging options in Crete are the Super 8 and the Crete Inn.

Leading up to the tour we have heifer raffle tickets available. The heifer raffle program was created to help youth start their own herd with the proceeds going towards scholarship money for our Angus youth. All proceeds made in a given year will be given out the same year in scholarships. This year the heifer is being donated by B-Gee Angus of Linwood. We greatly appreciate their generous donation and support! The heifer will be on display during the tour at the Crete fairgrounds stop. Tickets may be purchased at the Nebraska State Fair, the tour, by contacting a board member, or simply contacting the Nebraska Angus Association office!

Busy has been the way of life here, but super excited for the upcoming events offered for the Angus breed in Nebraska. We hope you can join us!

Mike Bredemeier was born and raised in the Stella, Nebraska, area and was always involved with cattle and crop production throughout his years growing up. After high school Mike

attended University of Nebraska Lincoln majoring in Animal Science and Business with plans to eventually return home. He worked for Hormel Foods for five years and returned home with his wife Chris in 1993. At that time, they were running a commercial cow herd and some purebred Limousin cattle and would finish them out and sell them on the grid. After getting hammered on a certain breed of cattle they started to transition to a purebred Angus program in 2002 with purchasing some bulls and females. This was their beginning to the Angus world.

In 1995 Mike had started A.I.'ing so that was already in the mix and then he bought into embryo transfer in 2015. Through raising most of their replacement females and buying some select ones they have gotten to where they are today. Bredemeier Angus first started raising bulls for their own use and when they started having more than they needed they went to the Nebraska Bull Test in Broken Bow,

Nebraska. They sent bulls there for 10 years and then decided to stay home with their bulls and raise them to have a local sale in their area. This past year was their 7th sale on their own and they are very happy with their vision. The main cow lines are Lady, Blackcap, Blackbird, Elba, Blackcap

May, and Erica. AI sires being used are Wilks Regiment, ZWT Infusion, Double Wide, Drag Iron, Fair N Square, and Iconic. Their production sale is the first Wednesday of March every year at the farm in Stella.

One challenge Bredemeier Angus has encountered is getting their name out there in their corner of the state that is predominantly a row crop area. Some goals they have set is to someday raise that AI stud that is recognized nationally and would like to be a "go to breeder" in their part of the state.

Mike and Chris's two sons Logan and Conner have been involved since an early age and are a part of the operation on a daily basis. Colton is their full time employee and was strictly a crop guy when he started, but has transformed into a good cattle hand and is starting his own herd also. One thing around their operation is usually something gets changed every summer before the next set of calves are weaned or the next calving season. They are always looking for ways to be more efficient with their time, cattle, resources, or make things safer or

friendly for the animals and humans. Their "home place" was homesteaded and has been in the family for over 150 years.

They welcome you all to the Nebraska Angus Tour and for those of you who may not know Mike is currently serving as the southeast director on the Nebraska Angus Association board of directors.

## **A**NDERSON BROTHERS ANGUS Long Range Goals

Anderson Bros. is owned and operated by brothers Floyd, and Robert, along with others including: Tim Anderson and Vaughn Domeier who serves as consultant and mentor. Anderson Brothers is a diverse operation, which is home to 280 head of commercial cows and heifers, farming 2,600 acres of corn/soybean crop rotation that is irrigated with center pivots, and 4,000 acres of pasture in various locations. The cattle operation began in the 1970's with forty head of crossbred aged cows. They started using registered Angus bulls purchased from Vaughn Domeier Angus of Sutton, Nebraska in the late 70's.

In the early 90's they started A.I.'ing all their replacement heifers and nearly 25 years ago, they started to add some registered Angus heifers from Vaughn Domeier Angus and increased their cow numbers to 65 head of registered Angus cows. Late in 2013, they purchased 120 head of

The AI sires and sons of AI Sires of their older cows in the herd include: RB Tour of Duty, RB Active Duty, B&B Identity, SAV Angus Valley, Ellingson Top Shelf, Baldrige Colonel, RB Absolute Advantage, Connealy Blackhawk, Jindra Acclaim, and KR Pacesetter. For the young cows AI sires and their sons include: EXAR Stockfund, Ellingson Three Rivers, Linz Exemplify, Sterling Pacific, Ellingson Homestead, Hoffman Thedford, KR Quality, LAR Man in Black, SAV Magnum, LVVF Tanker, and Wilks Regiment. Sons of AI sires are being actively used as herd sires in the registered and commercial herds in the summer pastures.



My name is Morgan Meyer and I'm the owner, operator of MGM Angus LTD. The ranch is run by myself and with the help of my wife and our two beautiful girls. Our ranch is located in the southeast corner of Nebraska just south of Johnson. MGM has been a member of the American Angus Association from the very beginning and it's now going on over 25 years. With just over 50 head of momma cows and a handful of commercial cows running around we operate a smaller scale ranch that packs a large impact.

MGM Angus started out as a 4-H project that transformed into this idea of wanting to raise and market some of the area's best producing females. In the early years of developing our herd we traveled around the country seeking out the best genetics we could find in the industry. The Everelda Entense cow family was the main bloodline we went out to find and began to build our program around that family. Over the years we have expanded our bloodlines and incorporated the Blackbird family, and the Rita families as well. When it comes to selecting bulls to AI with, I select bulls first based on their appearance and how they function. I'm going to let out a secret "I'm not a numbers guy" I don't select bulls that have crazy numbers from one end to the other. Now I'm not saying I don't care about the EPD's but they just aren't the first thing I look at. We breed cows to bulls we like to look at and our cows are designed to be functional and have an athletic look to them.

Over the next few years, I would like to add to the operation and increase our numbers and now that the girls are getting older get them into showing. I would like to get them involved in different shows and activities associated with the show





*Fertility is Our Priority*  
In 1978 the drought in Oklahoma was severe, therefore, there were several Angus dispersals. Thus began S Diamond Angus. Of the nine current cow families that make up our herd, five of them go back to an Ankony cow from

that dispersal. The other four come from Nebraska Angus breeders. S Diamond Angus is owned by Kim and Lindy Siebert of Henderson and their children and grandchildren, Justin, Samantha, Riley and Kayde Haack of Clatonia and Kendall, Meghan, Easton, and Flynn Siebert. It was an Angus only herd until 1989 when using a bull called SCR Lone Star 411 brought forth a red calf. So now it is about 1/2 black and 1/2 red of about 120 spring cows and 20 fall cows.

In 1991 our first bull sale was held with a very different format. Having been raised with a feedlot mentality, I was looking to connect with commercial cattlemen. I had seen close-out sheets and results from packers, so that was part of my focus. We had a commercial herd in the beginning using terminal cross sires, but realized the Angus females were the important part of the equation.

Fertility was always our first priority, as AI was the only way we could afford better genetics. Performance came next, followed by carcass traits. We still weigh calves regularly and ultrasound bulls and replacements while feeding out our steers and feeder heifers, with carcass data collected.

We have a number of customers that feed out their own calves and sell them on the grid, while keeping back their own replacements. Therefore, our focus is on making them as successful as possible. While not everyone has

those options, our customers do sell their calves to a lot of repeat buyers, because of those similar results.

Keeping all three of these elements in balance does make finding bulls to use difficult at times, because of the marketing of single element standouts.

Nearly every cattleman enjoys looking at their cattle. So having an element of eye appeal and structural soundness has always been a priority as well. The last two years we have taken red bulls to Denver and showed the Champion Senior Bull there as well. We may be looking at taking a pen of black bulls this coming year.

Our program has been built on an intensive AI program, followed by using home raised herd bulls from cows that have proven themselves. When choosing bulls from our own herd, we try to select bulls that don't excel in any one area, but are very well balanced. For instance, a bull that is not a true heifer bull that is in the top 8 for weaning, yearling, gain and scans in the upper half for both marbling and rib eye would be a good candidate. Come and see this year's calf crop sired by Ellingson 3 Rivers, Connealy Big Valley, HF Alcatraz, DL Automatic, LVVF Tanker, LAR Man in Black and our own bull Optimus. We look forward to visiting with you this year on the Nebraska Angus Tour!

**H**OLLMAN ANGUS  
*Lifetime of Experience*  
Hollman Angus is owned by Dick and Sondra Hollman. The calves produced by Ray and Vicki Hollman are also registered under Hollman Angus. Dick and Sondra have four mature daughters and 12 grandkids. All four daughters grew up showing breeding heifers and horses. Three of the grandkids showed calves this summer.

The official name Hollman Angus started in 2009 but prior to that all the

cattle were under the family farm, Hollman Angus Farm, which began in 1962. Dick grew up showing 4H heifers picked out of the HAF herd and has kept showing and raising Angus for the last 60 years.

Dick purchased his first cows in 1979 from Larry and Jan Schmutte near Cheeney, Nebraska. He started selling bulls on the Royal Hoofers Bull test in 1980. In 1986 he started to AI and thought he knew how to AI without going to a class because he was really good at palpating heifers in his Innerconology class at the UNL before he graduated in 1980. But with a zero-conception rate he decided to take an AI class in 1987. In 1992 he had his first high gaining bull on the bull test and first \$2000 bull. Quality kept increasing with the use of AI. Fall of 1992 he had his first Grand Champion bull At the Nebraska State Fair open class and that bull brought \$4000 at the Nebraska Cattlemen's Classic, even though that bull had a 120 lb. birth weight. In 1997 they started to flush donors and put embryos in. In 2003 a good friend Bob Pavlish wanted to invest in the cattle business so the partnership started buying high quality embryos and a few donors mostly at the Foundation Female Sale at Denver. In 2004 he took his first pen of bulls to Denver. That was a great learning experience and was fun but was expensive. One of those bulls was a full brother to BR Midland.

2006 Hollman Angus had its first all ET Bull sale at the farm and they began the lease of the Trout Angus Herd. It was a good high performance well managed herd. Many of the sires

used in that herd were high gaining bulls from the NE Bull Test. The first all ET female sale started in 2007. The herd grew to 160 cows and 2 cooperative herds. But when the recession 2008 hit, investments dried up and the genetic defects that came out hit pretty hard. Hollman Angus just kept looking forward, not back.

Sales continued to grow until 2018 when some health issues caught up with both Dick and Sondra. They decided to downsize and start preparing for retirement. They currently sell bulls on big Iron with several other breeders, mostly ones they helped get started in the Angus business. Today, Hollman Angus consists of 25 cows, half spring calving and half fall calving. Dick says calving season is still the most fun part of the year where you get to see the quality of the mating's you choose. But Sondra says the worst words she wants to hear is "Get Up We Have To Pull A Calf." Luckily that doesn't happen very often.

Dick is all about data and epd's. When they sold 50 bulls on their sale the epd's and dollar values of the sale bulls were above average on every epd. They will not use a bull unless they have good calving ease, growth, maternal traits, a scrotal above 1, docility in top half, good feet, excellent marbling, good REA and

good tenderness. Not everyone looks at tenderness but it is the next step to producing beef that is the best anyone has ever tasted. Dick says the two best rewards of being in the business is helping new breeders be successful like selling their first \$5000 bull. Helping young kids that would not have a chance to show a good heifer and teach them how to be a good showman.

Some of the latest bulls used at Hollman Angus include Poss Maverick, Doc Ryan, Raven Republic, KCF Bennett Exponential, Poss Rawhide, and Bullerman Significant. The current herd bulls are a high marbling, Bubs Southern Charm son from Herbster Angus and a Doc Ryan Bull we raised that has 15 epds and \$ values in the top 10%. For the future, Hollman Angus wants to continue to consult anyone that will listen and promote the Angus business, so it will stay the number one breed in the world and keep improving. They look forward to seeing many old friends and meeting new friends on the Nebraska Angus Tour.

## **H**OLLMAN ANGUS FARM *Historic Herd Celebrates Over 50 Years of raising Registered Angus Cattle*

Hollman Angus Farm was established in 1960 with the first animals registered in 1961. In 2011, Hollman Angus Farm was awarded the Historic Angus Herd Award from the American Angus Association for 50 years of raising Angus cattle. The herd was started by Henry Hollman and his wife Marjorie with the purchase of cattle from local herds such as Bohmont Angus of Martell, Robin Spence of Crab Orchard, Marshall Logan of Diller, LB Todd of Murray and Glen Railsback of Humboldt. In 1960, Earl Bohmont gave Rod and Randall (Pete, the two oldest of six

Hollman children) an orphan heifer, Pride Effie 120.

Rod still has cows that trace back to that original cow.

Throughout the years, all six of their children have been involved in showing cattle in 4-H. An interesting fact to note is that in the 1960's, Henry was the 4-H Leader of the Lone Star 4-H club and in the 70's and 80's, Rod was leader. The Hollman family has continued to be involved in leadership of that 4-H club as Rod's brother Richard was also a leader and now Rod's daughter Cheri maintains that tradition of passing cattle knowledge onto area youth. Henry dispersed his cows in 1984. He passed away in 1994 and Marjorie followed two years later in 1996. Rod served in the U.S. Marine Corp from 1967 to 1971 and he and his wife, Linda were married in 1969. Rod continued raising Angus cattle after his discharge in 1971. Linda grew up raising Herefords, her father Marvin Bohmont owned a herd of Horned Herefords near Martell. In 1976, Rod & Linda purchased 80 acres adjacent to the farm where he grew up. Later, they expanded their land ownership by purchasing 70 acres that remained from his mother Marjorie's (Spellman) family, land which had been in the family since 1868. Rod and Linda currently own 360 acres and rent another 350 acres.

Rod and Linda have three children, Greg, Scott, and Cheri, nine grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren. Rod, Linda along with children Greg (son's Jonathan and Jackson) and Cheri and husband Mike (Son's Codie, Ryan, and daughter Riley) help run a herd of

approximately 60 cows near Martell. We have also incorporated embryo transfer within the herd to be able to offer the highest quality of cattle. Greg, Cheri & Mike Worm, and Codie Hollman all also run their own herds within Hollman Angus Farm, making this a true family operation. Greg Hollman runs his herd by Crete Nebraska, Codie Hollman, and his wife Kaylee (who also raises simmental cattle by Wymore) run their herd by Martell, with Cheri and Mike Worm running their herd by Martell next to the old Marvin Bohmont homestead. This operation gives us a wide variety of traits and bloodlines to offer people in their herds on every playing field.

Currently, Rod and Linda's grandchildren are the 4th generation to raise and show Angus cattle with the great grandchildren to soon make a 5th generation to show Angus cattle.

The herd of registered cows are of the following bloodlines: Pendleton, Roundup, Poss Maverick, Mitty in Focus, SQ Credence, Summitcrest Complete, Connealy Thunder, Connealy Conquest and Ironwood New Level. 
