Though it can be chaotic, the fair offers a reward that's hard to match. It shapes our youth into

teaching them hard work, dedication, and commitment to whatever project they take on. It keeps agriculture and home economics thriving, ensuring the next generation learns to build, and create rather than simply consume. For me, there's nothing sweeter than seeing that first fair ribbon earned by a child who spent the past year pouring their heart into their project. The excitement, the beaming smile, and the friendships formed will never get old.

A lot of county fairs will be over by the time this issue comes out, but the Nebraska State Fair will be quickly approaching. The Nebraska Angus Association is looking forward to this year's state fair and will be there to help promote our Angus breeders. For anyone that would like to exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair the early entry deadline is August 10th. Late registration is until August 15th but entry fees will be doubled. All entries have to be made online at https://www.statefair.org/ag-competitions/ livestock-exhibitors/open-class-livestock/. The open beef cattle show will take place August 27th at 9:00 AM. Angus will be shown in Ring 1 following Red Angus. Check-in will take place at your stall the day prior and all cattle should be in place by 10 AM. The Nebraska Angus Association splits an extra \$500 to the top Nebraska Bred & Owned bull and female.

After the state fair we will kick off this year's Nebraska Angus Tour and let me tell you, we have a fantastic lineup this year in the beautiful Sandhills. The headquarters will be at the Niobrara Lodge in Valentine. The tour will follow the area along Highway 20 from Cody to Bassett. To start off this year we will have our first ever 3-person golf tournament followed by the annual meeting and banquet with awards that night. The following two days will consist of cattle displays, ranch visits, sponsor presentations, and special interest stops including Larsen Embryo, Niobrara Vineyards, and CS Potato Farms. For more information or to get registered for the tour or golf tournament please visit our website www.nebraskaangus.org and click on the Events & Programs tab. This year we will be doing registration with QR codes. For those of you that may not know how QR codes work, you simply pull up the flyer that has the QR code via the magazine, your computer, or a cell phone. Then you take your cell phone (if scanning a flyer from our magazine or your computer) or another cell phone (if scanning a flyer from a cell phone) and open your camera on your cell phone. Hover the camera over the QR code and a link should pop up below the code. Click that link and it will direct you to a google doc form that you can fill out and submit. Payment can be mailed to Nebraska Angus Association at Po Box, 245, Long Pine, NE 69217. If problems arise or you rather not mess with the tech side of it, please contact the office and I can sign you up. We hope you make plans to come to this year's tour! It will have lots to offer including great Angus cattle displays, socialization, amazing food, and the heifer being donated by A&B Cattle of Bassett for the raffle! Keep watching our

Dear Fellow Nebraska Angus Breeders,

This summer's rain certainly has been a blessing after a record dry spring but I'm hopeful the breeding season has gone well for you all. I don't know about you, but I've been watching summer sales on the video markets as well as the local sale barns. Many of the commercial cattlemen who have purchased registered Angus genetics are selling their calves and yearlings are seeing record prices. That follows a successful sale season for Angus breeders and sets cattlemen up for a profitable year.

While we enjoy the benefits of a cattle market in the producer's favor, we are also seeing the results of decades of selection pressure for carcass merit. For the first time in history, USDA Prime surpassed Select carcasses in not a one-week fluke, but in a consecutive week's trend. At the same time, we know more than 80% of the U.S. cow herd is Angus influenced.

That's a credit to you, the breeders of registered Angus genetics. As you've continued to bring quality genetics to the marketplace, commercial producers are investing wisely and making a difference for the consumer. That genetic investment means that CAB brand continues to lead the premium beef category, and we saw a new all-time monthly sales record in March for the brand with 113.8 million pounds of CAB sold.

I also encourage you to share the Angus Link program with your commercial customers. Enrollment in the program can help them describe the genetics of their calf crop on sale day that has the potential to turn into premiums.

I hope you've also had the opportunity to see the updates made to the National Cattle Evaluation in




May. They included the release of the Functional Longevity, Teat Size and Udder Suspension EPDs into full production. Made available on all registered Angus cattle on May 23, there were also updates to \$Maternal Weaned Calf Value index. In addition, the Angus Genetics Inc. team adjusted the calculations used for the Heifer Pregnancy EPD to improve its accuracy.

I encourage you to take the time to familiarize yourself with the new selection tools and begin to factor them into your herd planning. Resources on the data backing the new EPDs are available on *Angus.org*.

No doubt you have probably heard about the methane livestock efficiency research AGI will be doing over the next five years. I encourage you to read about the research at https://bit.ly/Methane Research. The project will give our researchers an opportunity to study efficiency on grazing cattle which is highly anticipated information for many.

If you have any questions about the research or any other Association topics, please contact me anytime. I look forward to hearing from you and discussing important issues regarding the future of our great Angus breed.


currently a freshman at Kansas State University, and I am so thankful for the life lessons that the Nebraska Angus Association has given me!

While the Nollette brothers had their day jobs, Lou & Neal as Priests, Greg & Tim as **Agricultural Education Teachers** together they started their own ranch and established a beef cow herd in 1986. Though they were tough times to be involved in agriculture the Nollette roots were from Nenzel, so the brothers were determined to stay.

Turning the corners to the third generation of Diamond Lazy J partners, Brent and Justin, sons of Tim & Terri Nollette were able to return home to their roots to continue to carry out the love of teaching agriculture, raising registered Angus and Gelbvieh replacement stock, and working in entrepreneurship with Niobrara Valley Vineyards owned and operated by Greg & Tim.The ranching focus of the Nollette brothers has always been with the commercial

cattleman in mind. Utilizing balance trait selection with priorities given to calving ease, fertility, maternal traits, growth, and carcass traits. Brent & Justin are always looking at ways to efficiently & effectively grow the herd. Choosing high quality sires along with having a tight AI protocol and

utilizing Embryo work allows for the genetics of this program to continue to develop, rise and grow.

Whether it is a meal provided by Terri, the catalog being designed by Jennie the wife of Brent, the photography & video work by Joslyn the wife of Justin, or the kids tagging along to help get a job done, it truly is a family operation which is only one of the sole parts of Diamond Lazy J Ranch.

The importance of family, faith and friends are all integral to the ranching lifestyle of the Nollette's. The hospitality of the Nollette family is welcoming to all their friends and neighbors, welcoming visitors anytime!

Over 100 years and five generations of hard work, grit and determination for raising superior Angus cattle earned the Arlen and Becky Sawyer of A & B Cattle the

Heritage Foundation Award from the American Angus Association in 2022.

It was a mixed blessing, as the honor was awarded posthumously to Arlen Sawyer. After decades of sustaining and growing the family's herd, Arlen passed away in 2019.

Becky now co-owns A & B Cattle with her son Adam Sawyer and daughter Jessica Sawyer-Slingsby. Adam and his wife Jenessa and their two children Augustus and Truett are the day-to-day operations managers of the ranch. Jessica and husband Brian play an active role on a part-time basis as well. Becky continues to help with bookkeeping and "giving advice" as Adam refers to her contribution.

The A & B ranch, carrying the initials of Arlen and Becky, is now officially named Sawyer A & B Cattle, LLC. However, people still know them as A & B Cattle and as a strong, long-time family operation running about 600 spring and fall calving cows.

The Sawyers' focus has remained the same over the years with breeding emphasis on calving ease and newborn vigor, accelerated growth to a year of age, moderate mature frame size and good dispositions.

"We have been submitting phenotypic data for over 45 years and genotypic data for 17 years to more accurately identify those traits," Becky said. A & B Cattle was one of the first herds to participate in Maternal Plus data collection and collected fertility information for a research project prior to that.

Even with an aggressive AI program, Adam Sawyer has seen the need to step up herd sire acquisition to work in tandem with the AI program. Current herd sires owned by the operation will be available at the A&B tour site for viewing, along with some of their progeny.

With the younger generation of Sawyers taking over the management reins of the operation, they have made some changes, adding more rotational

grazing, referencing pastures to accommodate the rotations, replacing some older windmills and adding solar wells in more strategic watering locations. Adam has also taken more aggressive management of cedar tree eradication and adding tree groves to enhance winter shelter in key locations.

Along with these improvements, Adam is steadfast in improving phenotypes of all the seedstock while keeping a balanced genotype with emphasis on the traits most essential to Sandhills ranchers. Cow longevity is also of great importance and a trait A & B Cattle has been submitting data on for over 20 years.

A & B Cattle holds an annual bull sale on the first Thursday in April at their ranch headquarters south of Bassett.. The sale includes 40 commercial purebred Angus yearling heifers and 10 elite registered Angus females as well as 150 spring and fall born bulls.

"As all those generations who went before us," says Adam, "we've gone through a lot of changes in the past six years since Arlen's passing." He remembers a lesson well learned from his dad, "we have to wake up each morning with the attitude that we will do better today."

IZNER CATTLE CO
Proud of our roots
Kody and Heather both

have roots in commercial cattle operations. Kody was born in Springview, NE where he helped with his family's herd and worked at a backgrounding feedlot. Kody got a welding degree from Northeast and worked with a crew building an asphalt plant in Grand Island and on the Natural Gas line in West Virginia.

After travelling a bit, he decided there was no place like home and worked on several different ranches in NE and SD that focused on cow/calf and yearlings.

Heather was born in Valentine, NE and grew up ranching with her

family at Harms Cattle Co. She started her career in genetics at the young age of six working with her dad developing and AI'ing heifers. She started out sorting heats but eventually moved into thawing and loading guns for many thousands of head. Since 2012 she has worked with Larsen Veterinary Embryo Transfer as an embryologist and customer service representative.

With the help of both of their families, Kody and Heather have slowly built their commercial herd since 2011 up to 65 head with their home based at Harms Cattle Co. near Valentine. Their registered herd started with a group of 17 bred cows

purchased from Carter Family Angus in 2018. They have built that number up to 65 head by retaining heifers and purchasing a few bred heifers & cows along the way. The herd has expanded quickly utilizing embryo transfer on a few proven donor cows.

Bloodlines on the cows vary but have a heavy base in Renown, Upwards 307R, and Visiontopline Royal Stockman. We tend to use AI sires that are tried and proven such as Net Worth, Hoover Dam and Upwards 307R, but we do test out a few young bulls here and there such as Schiefelbein Gable and Browns Double Decker.

The main goal we are aiming for is to build a productive, yet functional cow herd. Summer grazing is done away from the ranch on leased ground, but the rest of the year the cows are located south of Valentine. Both the hay put up, and the after grass are fairly poor quality nutritionally. The cows we have need to maintain their condition, breed back, and still raise a good calf without much "extra" given. With excellent dams as a base, we should be able to produce bulls that work well for our clients.

In 2022, they welcomed their son Waylon to the family. He loves being outside on the ranch and especially anything that has an engine. We hope he has a passion for good cattle, registered or not! In 2024 they also took on the endeavor of being a dealer for By-o-reg+ mineral by Advanced Ag Products.

Bulls are offered via a private treaty sale in February at Harms Cattle Co where they were weaned and developed.

generations of Sandhillers. They value an easy-keeping, trouble-free, fertile cow that can produce year after year through heat, drought, and cold. This is why their breeding goals are female-oriented in their registered Angus herd. They are utilizing genomic EPD data in their cow herd to enhance the accuracy of EPD values within their breeding program. It's science, though frustratingly hard to pin down in any one individual. By God's design, the code is hard to crack, but that doesn't stop them from putting every effort into trying. They're breeding for that bombshell phenotype, but with performance, carcass traits, and strong maternal ability. The maternal traits are the most complex to achieve because there are so many "moving parts" that are hard to measure but very important: docility, feet, milk, udder structure, fertility, and calving ease which all lead to reliable females with longevity.

Their bull and heifer customers can appreciate the phenotypes that

line up with what's needed in the Sandhills and can be confident that the unseen genomic traits are there to make the most complete animal possible, which in turn also makes them the most versatile. Bowlin bulls are designed to produce high performing feeder cattle that gain and

grade well, and also produce heifers that are high quality replacements.

The Bowlin's have 3 grown daughters who all help with the cattle when needed, especially in bull sale preparations. They grew up actively involved with cattle care and

with cattle care and 4-H, and learned how

to work. Robin and Erick Wickman, along with Adalin, August, Heston, and Boone live fairly close and often come to help. They also produce some outstanding Angus bulls and had the high-selling SimAngus bull on the Bowlin sale in February 2025. Jodi and John Crile live in Chadron and help out on big workdays. Jodi is a super supportive encourager. Kelli and James Meusch live north of Stuart and have been tremendously helpful in online advertising, catalog production, and also contribute a few high-quality bulls to the Bowlin sale.

Dale spends his Sundays serving as pastor to two congregations, one thirty miles south of Nenzel, and one in Cody. As a Bible reader and Spirit-led believer, Dale teaches practical ranching applications of the Word for everyday use. He preaches what their family practices, as well as the other way around. His herd was based on a set of

sires and their daughters bred back and forth to build a consistent and solid set of working Angus Females that focused on Maternal, Milk, and Muscle. He started with Marriott of WR Bar 8055 "AAA: 11149165" that WR Bar, Ben Lawson, and Fabulous Females Limited displayed at Denver! He was known for producing fabulous and long lived productive daughters! Richard has a cousin north of Mullen, NE that has a tremendous herd of cows that over 95% of the cows carry Marriott in their pedigree still to this day! W R Bar Matchmaker 700 "AAA: 12894970" a son of Sitz Traveler 8180 was another of his best female makers and produced a couple of his

vorite cows W R
Bar Everelda 9 and
W R Bar Everelda
90! WR Bar
Medicine Man 910
"AAA: 13439234"
was another foundation sire he built
on! 910 was an own
son of Shoshone
Viking GD60 out of
an own daughter of
Ankonian Dynamo!

The rotation of these sire's on each other's

daughters built a set of momma cows that were second to none.

As time and the beef industry progressed so did Richard in his breeding decisions. He moved into more modern sires such as JR Fast Forward, Nelsons Imax, Tehama Tahoe, Millars Duke, Sitz Logo, Stellar, and Barricade along with other notable sires. Through it all though his focus has never wavered from producing the Ideal Angus Cow and he ran his cowherd just as any commercial cattleman in the area did. They foraged in the summer on pasture, wintered through the deep MN snow on prairie hay, with tubs for

a bit of protein. His cows were never pampered or calves creep fed allowing for nature to select the ideal female to survive and multiply! For 32 years he has held an annual production sale at his ranch in Pequot Lakes, MN where his loyal customers have come year after year to evaluate and find Angus cattle both yearling bulls and heifers with maternal function and real world performance.

As time passes age catches us all and Richard nearing 78 years old, changes were needing to be made and after many hours of discussion, it was decided that the WR Bar Ranch cowherd would be sold to his youngest daughter Sherry Andrews and her Husband Ben and be moved to Rose, NE where they had found some grass to rent neighboring the operation they currently manage in the fall of 2024. The cowherd now resides 20 miles from a Ranch Richard's grandparents owned north of Burwell Nebraska back in early 1920's.

They have been managing the same ranch since Nov. of 2008 when they began managing and building Spring Valley Ranch, a registered Angus herd that focused on Maternal Forage Based Genetics till its dispersal due to owner's health in the spring of 2023, through today with the new owners. Sherry and Ben have extensive knowledge after being involved in both the Registered and Commercial Side of the Beef industry and plan to use that knowledge to build the best Angus Genetics they can to meet the needs of today's beef producers. They plan to blend and apply what they learned from building SVR and running Commercial Cattle to their genetic decisions for the WR Bar Angus herd!

We work daily to improve the selection tools we can provide to our customers through incorporation of technology and improved data collection and submission. Smith Angus Ranch calf crops have included parentage verification and genomically enhanced EPDs since 2015.

The bull development program has been crafted and honed with the commercial customer front of mind. Bulls are brought along slowly on a high roughage diet using native prairie hay for an honest look to express their genetics...not hide mistakes under fat. Throughout the entire development period, bulls are provided a complete chelated mineral source to ensure the highest fertility and structural development in your genetic investment for years to come.

In addition to the registered cows, the ranch includes a yearling development segment. Calves are purchased in local sale barns throughout the winter months and sorted into groups. They are slow grown on high roughage rations through the winter and run on rough, choppy sandhills through the summer grazing period until marketed at Bassett Livestock Auction.







Bill Rishel To Be Honored with 2025 Saddle & Sirloin Portrait Award

Illiam H. (Bill) Rishel of North Platte, NE has been named the 2025 inductee of the prestigious Saddle and Sirloin Portrait Gallery. Rishel will become the 380th member of this historic gallery and his portrait will be unveiled at an induction banquet to be held on Nov. 16 during the North American Livestock Exposition in Louisville, KY.



During research for his nomination Rishel explained, "Since 1966, the year I was privileged to be on the Penn State National Champion Livestock Judging Team in Chicago, 1 have admired the stories and lifetime contributions of previous honorees of the Saddle and Sirloin Club. I believe that early exposure to this special place was my driving force to not only breed a great herd of purebred Angus but also to become actively involved in cattle industry organizations, contributing my ideas and time to help make all beef producers more successful."

Not many Angus producers can claim to have successfully touched every segment of the beef industry during their lives. Even fewer can say they produced a groundbreaking purebred bull that today has more than three million registered descendants going 11 generations back.

Bill Rishel can make both of those assertions. From his childhood days

managing successful 4-H beef projects, to his animal science degrees and impressive livestock judging record at Penn State University during the 1960s, Bill was well prepared for a career in the beef industry. In 1975, with limited resources, Bill and his wife Barb made the bold decision to leave New York and move to Nebraska to establish themselves within the western cattle industry. With their three young daughters, Jill, Joy and Judy, the bull New Criterion, 12 purebred Angus females and a shared passion for good cattle and a vision of excellence, together, they began developing Rishel Angus at North Platte.

Bill Rishel's distinguished, unselfish service to the beef cattle industry stands as testimony to the roots from which he originated in Pennsylvania. Early in life, he realized that hard work and determination were attributes needed for success in any endeavor. Always with an eye to the value of maternal inheritance, he crafted his own brand of genetic selection to produce game-changing Angus cattle that led the worldwide industry toward a more focused consumer product.

Nominating Committee Chair Michael Bishop, PhD stated: "Our committee documented Bill's lifetime commitment to the beef cattle industry as inspiration for future generations of breeders, producers and leaders. We are pleased that he has been recognized with our industry's lifetime achievement award. It is our goal to tell the Bill Rishel story as an inspirational pathway for younger generations to courageously follow his footsteps of perseverance, hard work and foresight with every aspect of their careers."

The self-described "fearless to a fault" Angus breeder has always been willing to seek wisdom from those he respects, to not be afraid to be in the minority, to accept change when it is predicated on real economic value, and to base breeding decisions on sound principles that will create success for all segments of the industry with the consumer at the front of the line.

Rishel has had many industry firsts and achievements through the decades. In 1974, Bill led a group of breeders, Genetic Breed Improvers, in the purchase of the first syndicated bull in the history of the Angus breed, Northern Prospector 14. In 1981, Rishel Angus purchased the bull, "AAR New Trend." The commercial industry recognized the value of the bull and in 1986, Bill embarked on a structured sire evaluation program beginning with New Trend to measure carcass merit, place emphasis on quality and a satisfactory eating experience for consumers that continues today. In 1990, a grandson of New Trend, B/R New Design 036, was born into the herd and later became a leading sire of Angus Pathfinder females and the foundation sire of all New Design Angus cattle. He was the top sire for Angus registrations in 2001 and 2002. Today, 036 is recognized as one of the top carcass quality Angus sires with over 3,200,000 descendants in the pedigrees of the American Angus Association.

In 1996, along with three of his bull customers, Bill attended one of the first organizational meetings of U.S. Premium Beef in Hays, Kansas. He became part of the first wave of producers to invest in the new model of the company as a value-added system in the beef value chain. The next year, Bill was struck by the fact he had been heavily invested in testing for carcass merit, but did not have an idea of what, if any, the value difference was between a superior individual and an average individual in the population for total product value. He contacted Glen Dolezal, then working at Oklahoma State University, to take carcass data from some of the tested sires and process it through the "Box Beef Calculator" Dolezal had developed to calculate retail value. From this information, the American Angus Association embarked on developing \$Values that are criteria for genetic selection today.

During the last 60-plus years, Bill has received numerous honors, held dozens of volunteer leadership roles in state and national beef organizations and with education institutions,

judged numerous cattle shows and presented many impactful presentations. In typical candor, Rishel asserts that he is most proud of his wife, Barb, and her partnership in their life journey and businesses, as well as their three married daughters and their daughters' families.

A lifetime achievement highlight occurred last year when Nebraska Hall of Agricultural Achievement named Rishel its 2024 Honoree. University of Nebraska Chancellor Emeritus Ronnie D. Green shared that the award recognizes Rishel as an outstanding leader for all of Nebraska. He summarized, "Bill Rishel has led a life of exceptional servant leadership in the beef industry, as a master breeder of Angus genetics, an innovator in beef genetic improvement, and a strong advocate and mentor for educating the next generation of industry leaders."

In 2017, Rishel Angus became TD Angus at Rishel Ranch when the operation was sold to Trey and Dayna Wasserburger. Bill and Barb Rishel were introduced to the couple by a banker friend who thought they would be a good fit for the transition they had long considered, and deeply desired, to carry on their life's work.


So similar to a young Bill and Barb setting out from New York to Nebraska 42 years prior, Wasserberger tells the story of an extraordinary business succession, "In 2017, we purchased the entire Rishel Angus herd and ranch. There was never a negotiation. An accomplished, wellrespected cattleman turned over his life's work to a very inexperienced cowboy with nothing more than frank conversations, fearless eye contact and a firm handshake. Bill and Barb made it their business to help us succeed. I will never forget what it felt like to know they were there for us; to know they still believe in us."

Upon learning he has been selected as the 2025 inductee Rishel expressed, "It is a privilege to know that my contributions of time, effort, and ideas were vital to improving the lives of my family, community and, most importantly, the beef cattle

industry for all producers across the globe. I view this honor as a lifetime achievement award at the highest level of the agricultural industry."

An original oil portrait of Rishel, painted by renowned artist Richard Halstead, has been commissioned and will be framed and hung when the award is presented at the North American International Livestock Expo in November.
